We are pleased to announce that our Volunteer Chaplains have been awarded the Mayor's Award for Community Service for 2025 at the ceremony hosted by The County Club on 26th April.

The Mayor of Guildford's Award for Service to the Community recognises individuals and organisations within the Guildford Borough who have made a significant positive impact on the lives of residents by going above and beyond in their service to the community. The award aims to celebrate and acknowledge the often unseen hard work and dedication of community volunteers and organisations.

Susanna Hoar, the project coordinator and Suzette Jones, a GP Chaplain, were there to collect the award.

Susanna shared "It is a real honour to receive this award. Our volunteers do a fantastic job in providing a non-judgemental and safe listening presence in the various placements across the town, including GP surgeries, the police, G Live theatre, George Abbot School, the homeless, and the elderly. This award is a great endorsement for the project and recognition of the time, support and commitment our volunteers give to the people, visiting, living and working in our town."

Angel Volunteers Lend Helping Hands During Packed Easter Weekend

Volunteer Chaplains Annual Conference March 2025

We were delighted to welcome over 100 attendees from the wider chaplaincy community including GTCC's own Volunteer Chaplains to GTCC's annual conference held at St Saviour's Church, Guildford. The invitation was extended to all those exploring, supporting or involved in chaplaincy to come and be encouraged, inspired and connected.





Attendees joined from chaplaincies working in Winchester, Bracknell and Basingstoke, along with army and police chaplains from across Hampshire, Surrey and Sussex as well as those more local to Guildford.

We were privileged to have Helen Watts lead the morning and she shared her extensive experience gained during her current work as a Chaplain for Wellbeing in Primary Care, Birmingham, as a former church pastor and her travels around the world training others for pastoral and spiritual care ministry.

She gave everyone attending so much to think about: an encouragement to practise respectful curiosity; a reminder of the power of listening; and how chaplains are different in offering that safe space and that this difference is such a blessing to share with others.

Tasty Tea Tent triumph!

The forecast for Easter Bank holiday Monday in Guildford was for thunderstorms and gusty rain showers. Not really what the Chaplaincy wanted when they planned a fundraising Tea Tent event in the grounds of St Martha-on-the-Hill Church, with its spectacular views of the surrounding Surrey Hills. But with prayers and some very dedicated volunteers, we set up our gazebo and laid out a magnificent display of homemade cakes and sweet treats, along with teas, coffees and a selection of cold drinks. We wondered whether anybody would come given the poor forecast but we needn't have worried because even though we didn't plan to open until 10am, people were starting to queue by 9.40am. Indeed by 11am most of our popular carrot cake and flapjack had already disappeared.

As well as serving refreshments we took the opportunity to share with visitors what the Chaplaincy is about, with volunteers showing guests what Street Angels carry with them and might encounter on a weekend night. Volunteer Chaplains and Community Angels were also had information leaflets available. Visitors were encouraged to make a donation for their snacks and drinks and we were amazed at the generosity of some of the people we met, including the person who gave us £5 for a single lollipop! Encouragingly the weather, as we prayed, stayed dry and sometimes sunny for most of the day, with a few spots of rain at the very end of our day.



We were visited by several church groups out on Bank Holiday walks, using the church as their planned destination, to help support the work of the Chaplaincy and the parish of Chilworth and St Martha's. By the end of the day all the many cakes had gone and over 250 drinks had been served. We are so grateful to the many people who stopped and supported us, the volunteers who served through the day and the many others who baked cakes, provided support and assistance or helped in pulling this successful fund raiser together. We're pleased to say over £1,100 was raised. So now we know for sure that 'a cup of tea makes everything better'.

Guildford Churches Unite for Good Friday Walk of Witness



On Good Friday, the churches of Guildford once again came together in a powerful expression of faith and unity during the annual Walk of Witness, organised by Rev Noelle Coe, the town's chaplain. This collaborative event brought together members from various congregations in a true spirit of community and shared purpose.

The Salvation Army led the music with their usual passion and skill, creating a deeply reflective atmosphere throughout the walk. Other local churches played vital roles, taking responsibility for stewarding, printing service sheets, delivering Bible readings, giving

reflections, and carrying the cross—each act contributing to the collective witness of the Christian faith.

Despite a forecast of rain, the weather held off until later in the day, allowing over 200 people to participate in the walk. The procession began at the Friary Centre and made its way up the High Street to Holy Trinity Church, drawing attention from passers-by and offering a moment of reflection to the wider community.

This year's Walk of Witness was described by many as deeply moving and spiritually uplifting—a special opportunity to publicly commemorate the significance of Good Friday and to stand together in faith.



Guildford Street Angels bags £1,000 from Tesco's Stronger Starts scheme

Guildford Street Angels has received £1,000 to contribute towards the cost of essential equipment to support our volunteers who help keep people safe late at night in the town centre. Local Tesco stores provide customers with blue counters which they are invited to place in an in store receptacle indicating which charity they want the £500, £1,000 or £1,500 to go to.

GTCC received the second highest count and so recently gratefully received a cheque for £1,000 from Kellie Morgan, the main Guildford store Community champion.



The Chaplaincy, along with Guildford Street Angels, was founded in 2008 as a response to the high level of antisocial behaviour in the town late at night. Almost overnight, tensions were calmed, crime dropped, and antisocial behaviour was reduced by around a third.

The project is run by Guildford Town Centre Chaplaincy, who continue to equip, train and nurture a team of some 50 brilliant volunteers provide compassionate care to anyone who finds themselves in difficulty. The teams provide a friendly patrol, every Friday and Saturday night, 10.30pm to 4am.

Angela Gammage, Street Angels Coordinator said:

"We are so grateful for this generous support from Tesco to help cover the costs of essential equipment. Grants like this enable us to come alongside young people in difficulty, helping them reconnect with friends, charge their phones, provide basic first aid, or a host of other simple solutions to help them get home safely and have a good night out."

Tesco's Stronger Starts – previously Tesco Bags of Help and Tesco Community Grants - has already provided over £115 million to more than 65,000 projects across Britain.

We are grateful for their partnership along with the recognition and support of Tesco customers this year.


Ann (bottom picture) will provide essential support to GP chaplains and serve as a key liaison with our partner surgeries.

Police Commissioner joins the team

Surrey's Police Commissioner, Lisa Townsend, has joined a team of Angels for the second time since being voted into her important position. We are grateful for her financial support and her willingness to experience first hand the way we help reduce town centre crime and support vulnerable people on weekend nights. The BBC News website reported the visit:

Surrey's Police and Crime Commissioner has spent a night with a group of volunteers who help revellers get home safely.

Lisa Townsend joined the Guildford Street Angels on one of their regular 10:30-04:30 Saturday shifts. The group helps people find their way home and offers support to those who are vulnerable or homeless. The group receives £5,000 from the commissioner's office each year. Ms Townsend said: "We've visited the train station, where we know trouble can happen during the evenings.

"We've spoken with door staff at a range of venues around the town and stopped to chat to young people enjoying their night out.

COMMUNITY ANGELS CELEBRATE AFTER RECEIVING £20,000 OF NATIONAL LOTTERY FUNDING

GTCC is celebrating after being awarded £20k in National Lottery funding to support the work of its well-respected Community Angels befriending project. Zoe Franklin MP was delighted to present a cheque to the GTCC team and chat to us about the project, making a great start to 2025.

Chris Britton, GTCC Chair, says, 'We're delighted that The National Lottery Community Fund has endorsed the value of our work with such a generous donation. We will be able to press on with greater confidence over the next two years to continue to walk alongside those facing a mix of very challenging issues, to help them make a positive step change to reconnect with others, and help rebuild broken lives.

We are so proud that our Community Angels are making a much-needed impact and that this has been recognized by recently receiving both the Lieutenancy Award for Excellence during the Pandemic and the Mayor of Guildford's Award for Service to the Community.'



The new funding is from The National Lottery Community Fund, which distributes money raised by National Lottery players for good causes and is the largest community funder in the UK. The funds will contribute to the on-going operating costs of delivering the project over the next two years, at time when demand is constantly rising.

Anne Thornton, Community Angels Coordinator, says, 'We are absolutely over the moon that we have been gifted this funding at a time of growing need for our services. We receive more referrals than we have the capacity to befriend and welcome enquiries from potential new volunteers to join our fabulous team of compassionate volunteers.'

Fundraising Update

The three projects run by GTCC cost around £120k pa to operate safely. We are very grateful for regular gifts that we receive from local churches and individuals, although increasingly we are dependent upon financial support from grants and running fundraising events. Currently GTCC operates with a planned deficit. Readers will be delighted to know that GTCC projects have been recognised by a wide range of funders over recent months. Here are just a few of the highlights:

Our **Ambassador Angels** have been supported by Surrey County Council who have generously funded a new laptop, projector, PA system and branded gazebo for outreach and fundraising events.

Our **Community Angels** have been supported by Guildford Poyle Charities, the Office of the Police & Crime Commissioners, and most recently by a tremendous grant from the National Lottery Fund to support this work in 2025-27.

Our **Street Angels** have also been supported by the Office of the Police & Crime Commissioner, Guildford Philanthropy, Charles Russell Speechlys and St Catherine's School. Meanwhile both the ASDA Foundation and Surrey Council have funded much needed volunteer equipment, including uniforms to keep our volunteers warm and dry as they provide their friendly patrols.

Our **Volunteer Chaplains** were honoured to have been chosen to be one of the Mayor of Guildford's Charities of the Year and to be a beneficiary of the sparkling fundraising 'Mistletoe Ball' held in December 2024.

GTCC ran or participated in a number of successful **fundraising events** in 2024 including the Pancake Race, the sponsored Angel Ascent at Guildford Cathedral, our autumn Quiz night, and we had a plant stand at the Summer Picnic at the Castle grounds. These events collectively raised £14,600 thanks to the support and energy of so many people. GTCC is always grateful for extra help with running events: please get in touch if you think you can help in this important area.

Life changing stories



Back in February, one of our team leaders, Mike Smith (left) was on duty when a young man came up to him and told the team, 'You (Street Angels) saved my life.' Slightly taken aback Mike asked him to tell us more and so he told us of how he had taken a cocktail of strong drugs, when he was aged 14, leaving him comatose outside the Friary. An Angel team had thankfully found him and somehow alerted his family and medical help which he believes saved his life. He expressed deep gratitude for being alive to thank those who had helped him that night.

Such stories are not unusual for our Angels. We heard from another young man recently that we had helped him when he was in a particularly anxious state and that we had stayed

with him and helped him when he most needed the support.

Mental health issues quite often surface whilst we're out patrolling. We've seen several attempts at self harm, where our interventions have meant that less harm has been done because we have been in the right place at the right time.
